Dane Nan Ye Dah Kaska Land guardians deployed the ARUS by road access in April 2024. Heli access sites were deployed in May 2024. There was a total of 9 ARUs deployed by road access, 9 ARU's deployed by heli access. We also had visitors from an emerging Alaskan guardian program assisting with Road deployment sites. Ducks Unlimited Canada assisted with the heli site deployment as they were based in wetland areas. Land guardians Tanya Ball, Lisa Horsey and Robbie Porter collected the ARU's in the month of October 2024.

DNY 9 was deployed April 22nd at McKenna Lake and retrieved on October 2nd, 2024.

DNY 5 (Wheeler Lake) & DNY 18 (Fireweed Lake) were deployed April 23rd, 2024 and retrieved October 1st, 2024

DNY 21, 12, 11 (Toad River area) & 14 (Moose Lake access road) were deployed April 24th, 2024 and retrieved October 4th, 2024


DNY 7 (Crooked Lake) was deployed April 25th, 2024 and retrieved October 3rd, 2024
