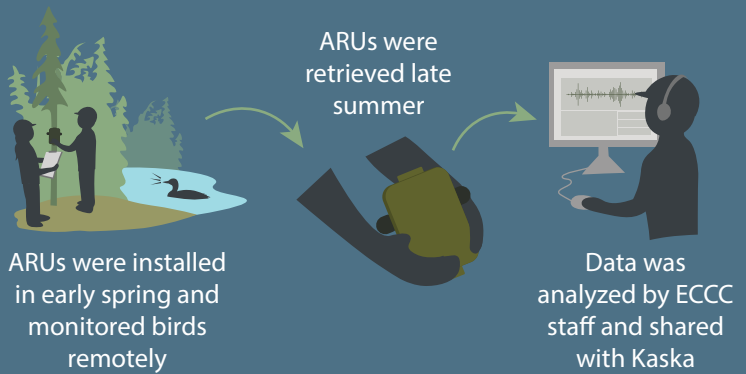


Kaska Bird Monitoring 2022/2023 Survey Results

Across British Columbia (B.C.), Indigenous community members play a key role in monitoring and managing wildlife. Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) is partnering with several Indigenous communities in the boreal region to collaboratively monitor land birds and other species of interest within their territories. This data helps to inform Canada-wide boreal bird population estimates, supports community-specific monitoring goals, knowledge sharing, and decision making.

ECCC biologists partnered with Kaska Land Guardians to monitor land birds using autonomous recording units (ARUs) in 2022 and 2023.
